The weekend was wonderful with some snow left from the last storm and a skiff arriving on Sunday afternoon. The moisture made the hunting better, but one thing you can take to the bank is that the birds are doing exactly what Pheasants and Chukar do best...hiding!

When you are out hunting, take it slow. They are there for sure, but with the cover the way it is this year, your dogs need to be more thorough and work the cover slow. Don't run through the grass fast...a lot of birds are getting shot in the heavy grass and it takes more time to find them for sure.

We are set for some more weather this week which will make the hunting great. It has been a lot of fun to hunt with some wet on the ground!

GIANT QUAIL HUNTS ARE BACK

Since we lost our Quail breeder last Christmas, we have been looking for a new Quail Producer and have found one that we like and have tried some of his birds and they are very good.

This means that we will offer the GIANT QUAIL HUNTS again this year. For those of you that are new and for those of you who can't remember, the GIANT QUAIL HUNT is an all day affair that gives four hunters the chance to kill 100 birds. This includes a guide and dogs but you are more than welcome to hunt these rockets with your own dogs without a guide. The cost this year is \$900 for the group. Remember, no more than four in a group.

We have 20 GIANT QUAIL HUNTS available to the first 20 folks that call or email to reserve them. We have to have the hunts scheduled by the 13th of December. The reason we do these hunts early in the year is that Quail are very fragile and do not do well in the very cold after the first of the year, and since we bring them in by the truck load, we don't hold them long as they go right into the field.

We have a special area for Quail that allows them to fly long distances and makes for a great hunt. Pick a day or two and let us know that you would like to hunt some Bobwhite Quail!

You can also schedule a GIANT CHUKAR HUNT and that is also 100 birds and four hunters for \$1500. These hunts are loads of fun and will test your shooting skills!
