CABELAS TO OPEN STORE IN GRAND JUNCTION IN 2010

Cabela's announced plans for its first Colorado store. A 75,000 square foot location is set to open in Grand Junction in the early summer of next year.

Cabelas (NYSE: CAB) has reported record results for the third quarter of 2009. According to their release, retail store revenues jumped 6.1% with a 3.5% increase in comparable store sales. Direct revenue decreased 6.2%, but the company lowered direct sales marketing costs by more than fifteen percent. That led to increased revenue per catalog page. The company's financial services revenue increased 15 percent as well.

61,000 ACRES IN COLORADO COULD BECOME FEDERAL LAND

U.S. Rep. John Salazar has introduced legislation within the House to designate about 61,000 acres in three southwest Colorado counties as federal wilderness.

The protected areas would include the Grand Mesa, Uncompahgre, Gunnison and San Juan national forests and Bureau of Land Management areas. The Lizard Head Wilderness and Mount Sneffels wilderness areas would be expanded under the measure.

GIANT QUAIL HUNTS ARE BACK

Since we lost our Quail breeder last Christmas, we have been looking for a new Quail Producer and have found one that we like and have tried some of his birds and they are very good.

This means that we will offer the GIANT QUAIL HUNTS again this year. For those of you that are new and for those of you who can't remember, the GIANT QUAIL HUNT is an all day affair that gives four hunters the chance to kill 100 birds. This includes a guide and dogs but you are more than welcome to hunt these rockets with your own dogs without a guide. The cost this year is \$900 for the group. Remember, no more than four in a group.

We have 20 GIANT QUAIL HUNTS available to the first 20 folks that call or email to reserve them. We have to have the hunts scheduled by the 13th of December. The reason we do these hunts early in the year is that Quail are very fragile and do not do well in the very cold after the first of the year, and since we bring them in by the truck load, we don't hold them long as they go right into the field.
