It is finally here! The 24th year of hunting at YOUR club! We started hunting on Saturday the 19th and have had hunters every day since. We have a corporate group out tomorrow and that means that there will be birds in most areas of the club after tomorrow. We put double limits in the field when we start hunting, so that makes your chances of getting your limit...or at least seeing them...a possibility during the start of the season. As you know, the hunting only gets better as time goes on.

The hunters that have been out are absolutely astounded when they see the cover. RMR member Lon Bradford has been coming for the last 20 years and told me yesterday that he has never seen the club like this and I told him that is what I have been telling everyone all summer! The rain and no hail has been the best thing that we could have had. This year will truly be one for the memory books!

The weather has cooled down a bit and it has been moist in the mornings too. (Yesterday it was a bit more than moist...rain and snow!) I have mentioned this in the past, but if the weather patterns of the summer continue into the winter, we might be in for a wet one. If that is the case, you might want to try to get some hunting in before winter really hits. I think the cover will handle the snows, but if you remember 2006....nothing could handle that wet white stuff! Don't wait to get your dogs and guns out for a walk.

Call the office or email a reservation and let's blow out the cobwebs and shoot some birds! Limits are still the same...5 Pheasants or 5 Chukar. We are looking at some Quail right now, but do not have anything firm on Quail hunts yet. We will know in the next few weeks if we will have any GIANT QUAIL hunts this year.

The hunt is \$4500 and that covers food, lodging meals, all inclusive except for license fee and travel to and from camp. The license fees are approx \$400 for everything. IRONY AT ITS FINEST

RICHMOND, Virginia - An executive for an anti-animal cruelty group says her 16-year-old blind and deaf dog died after she accidentally left him in her hot car for four hours.

Robin Starr, the CEO of the Richmond Society for the Prevention of Cruelty to Animals, says she didn't realize "Louie" was in the car until noon. Starr's husband, Ed, told the Richmond Times-Dispatch he put the dog in her car as she got ready for work Aug. 19. She often took the dog to work with her.

Robin Starr took the dog to two clinics, but he died of kidney failure.

The National Weather Service says the temperature had reached 91 degrees by noon that day.

The board of the SPCA says it still supports Starr, who has been CEO since 1997 and does not plan to resign. It was unclear whether she would be charged.

RESERVATIONS FOR HUNTING

You can email your request. Just let me know how many hunters there will be, what time you want to hunt... morning or afternoon, if you need a guide with dogs and what birds you would like to shoot (Pheasant and or Chukar). We will reply back to you with a confirmation and you will be good to go and we will expect to see you on that day. If you get an automatic response that I am out of town for some reason, you will need to call the office to make the reservations. I will let you know when I am traveling so you know that I won't be able to see email.

You can call the office. We are open in the office from 8am to 4pm to make phone reservations. If you call after hours, just leave a message and we will call you back the next morning to confirm your hunt. 719-635-3257

PLEASE PLEASE PLEASE **do not** call the clubhouse to make reservations, unless it is on the weekends. They have their hands full running the hunts and we keep the master schedule book at the office.
