ANCHORAGE, Alaska (AP) Alaska Wildlife Troopers say they rescued two men from Ohio after the pair interrupted a life-or-death struggle between a moose and a wolf.

Thirty-one-year-old Sean Evans of Toronto, Ohio, and his cousin, 30-year-old Josh Clark of Scio, were snowshoeing out to a cabin on the Kenai Peninsula south of Anchorage on Thursday when they rounded a bend in the trail and saw the wolf hanging from the moose's neck.

Clark tells the Anchorage Daily News that the wolf took off when they stumbled upon the scene, but the injured moose charged them. Clark climbed a birch tree and his cousin ducked behind a log.
